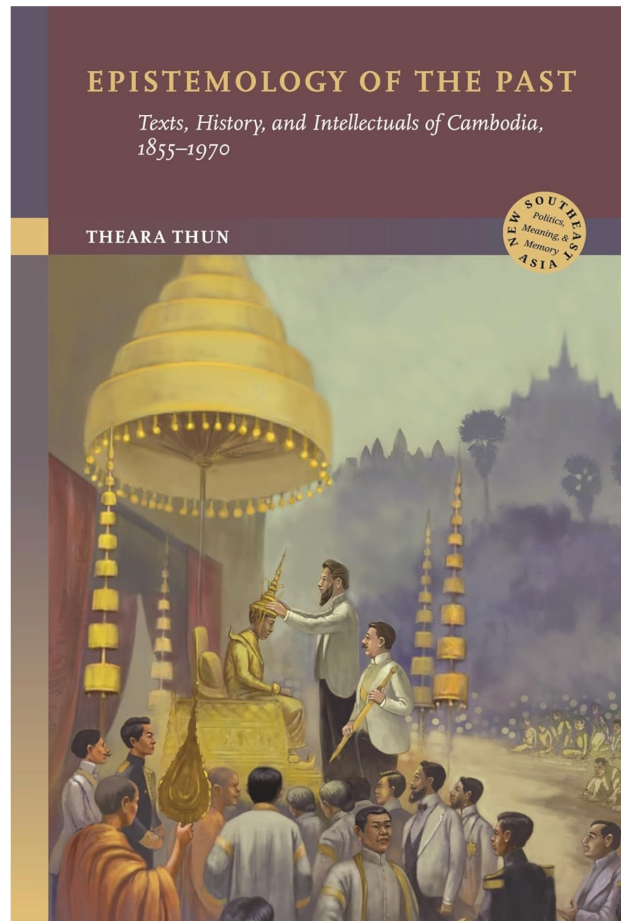

- A Khmer Rouge leader (2009):

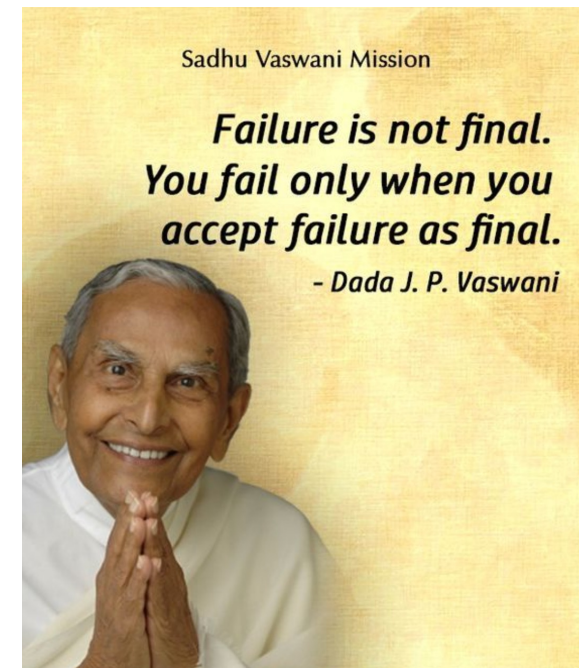
“If you don’t try at all, the only outcome is *failure*. However, if you give it a try, you open yourself up to the possibilities of *failure* and *success*.”

Scholarships/fellowships

Scholarships:

- generally awarded for academic achievement and help cover educational expense
- used to help students pay for tuition, fees, and other educational expenses
- a wide range of academic disciplines or areas of study

Fellowships:

- more specialized, often for advanced study or research, and provide support for a specific project or program
- awarded to support advanced study, research, or professional development in a specific field

Scholarships: more commonly awarded to support Master's and PhD studies

Fellowships: more frequent found in PhD and Postdoctoral programs

Scholarships

CUHK-MACUM Belt and Road Scholarship

The CUHK-MACUM Belt and Road Scholarship provides an opportunity for citizens from Belt and Road countries, who are leaders or trailblazers in the fields of arts and cultural management, to pursue a taught postgraduate Master's degree in Cultural Management.

Eligibility

- Applicants must be citizens of countries within the Belt & Road Initiative. For the full list of eligible countries, visit: [Belt and Road Initiative Countries](#).
- Preference will be given to applicants whose race, ethnicity, gender, religion, or nationality is underrepresented within the student body.

Scholarship Amount

- The scholarship covers full tuition, amounting to HK\$155,000 for the academic year 2025-26.

Application and Review Process

- Applicants must submit their admission application materials by 15 January 2025.
- **A cover letter indicating interest in this scholarship must also be included.**
- Applications will be evaluated based on academic qualifications, CGPA, work experience, and potential contributions to the field.
- Shortlisted candidates will be invited for a panel interview.

Announcement of Selection Results

- Scholarship recipients will be notified by March 2025.

The programme may choose not to award the scholarship if no suitable candidates are found.

2 PhD positions in Sustainability Research, focus on sustainable agri-food system governance 100%

The Sustainability Research Group at the University of Basel, led by Prof. Dr. Janina Grabs, is looking for two PhD researchers to investigate the governance of sustainable agri-food systems, with a particular focus on the implementation of mandatory sustainability legislation in tropical agri-food commodity chains, in the framework of the SNF-funded Starting Grant Project EXPECT-AGRI.

The project EXPECT-AGRI

The production of agricultural commodities such as coffee, cocoa, or palm oil is associated with deforestation, forced and child labor, and smallholder poverty. European governments currently aim to address these challenges via the introduction of mandatory supply chain sustainability legislation such as due diligence regulations and import restrictions.

This five-year research project aims to examine the impact of such sustainability laws in the supply chains of coffee, cocoa and palm oil. What expectations do these laws create between the regulatory authorities and the companies that trade in these commodities? And how do these expectations in turn influence the shift towards more sustainable agriculture? The project will examine these questions via a combination of qualitative (e.g. expert interviews, Q-methodology, case study analysis) and quantitative (e.g. company surveys) research, including fieldwork in commodity-producing countries.

Your position

As part of EXPECT-AGRI, the successful candidates will conduct longitudinal, qualitative research on policy implementation in three tropical agri-food commodity sectors (coffee, cocoa, and palm oil). One PhD candidate will focus on fieldwork in Colombia, and the other one will work in Côte d'Ivoire. You will further collaborate with postdoctoral researchers and mentor Master's students in the context of the project. The candidates will pursue a PhD degree in Sustainability Research and be enrolled in the University of Basel's Graduate School of Social Sciences. Place of work will be Basel, Switzerland.

Both appointments are scheduled to begin on March 1, 2025, or at the earliest convenience of the successful candidates.

Your profile

Applicants should have completed a Master's degree in a relevant field such as political science, political economy, public policy/administration, global governance, sustainability research, sociology, development studies, or another social science discipline, and achieved a minimum grade equivalent to 5 (out of 6) in the Swiss system. The candidates should have demonstrated experience in the use of qualitative research methods, and ideally have experience in living and/or working in the case study countries (Colombia or Côte d'Ivoire), or more broadly have experience in Latin America or West Africa.

We are looking for candidates with a proficient level in English and a second language (Spanish or French), excellent interpersonal and communication skills, a strong work ethic, the ability to work independently, and a high willingness to collaborate.

Both positions are for an initial period of one year, renewable for another three years after positive evaluation.

Postdoctoral fellowship

- Contribute new knowledge and insights to the academic community
- Publishing research findings in reputable journals/book presses
- Collaborating with supervisors, colleagues, and students
- Developing grant proposals to secure funding
- Teaching
- Handling specific research projects within their area of expertise

Postdoctoral Fellowships

1. Build a strong research background during your doctoral studies


- Publishing papers, presenting at conferences, some awards
- Co-authoring with your mentors/supervisors

2. A compelling research proposal

- Building of your PhD thesis
- Outlining your proposed project and its significance
- Deliverable outcomes

3. Connect with potential advisors and collaborators

- Strong letters of recommendation
- Practice for interviews

Postdoctoral Fellowships (cont.)

Things to avoid:

1. Lack of research fit
2. Poorly written application materials
3. Ignoring application instructions
4. Lack of clear research goals
5. Make overpromises

PhD

- Maintain a high GPA (BA and MA)
- Fulfil language requirement
- Attend international MA programs
- Write an MA thesis
- Build your CV on your academic achievements, research experience, publications, presentations, awards, and relevant skills.
 - Being a research assistant helps a lot

PhD (cont.)

- Explore different scholarships, grants, and fellowships available for Ph.D. students in your field of study and geographic region.
- Research potential Ph.D. advisors/supervisors whose research aligns with your interests and goals.
 - Not harmful to write to them to express your passion, qualifications, and research goals (remember the advice from the KR leader)
 - Just be ready for rejections or NO response!

PhD (cont.)

Craft a compelling research proposal

- A good research topic requires a lot of time to develop
- Feedback from mentors, advisors, or colleagues
- Do not be afraid of someone stealing your research topic

MA

- Maintain a high GPA (3–3.5) for BA
- Fulfil language requirement
- Attend international BA programs
- Writing an BA thesis is an advantage
- Build your CV on your academic achievements, presentations, awards, and relevant skills.
 - Being a research assistant helps a lot

MA (cont.)

- Explore different scholarships, grants, and fellowships available for MA students in your field of study and geographic region.
- Research potential advisors/supervisors whose research aligns with your interests and goals.
 - Not harmful to write to them
 - Just be ready for rejections or NO response!
- Craft a compelling research proposal

Comparing MA and PhD research proposals

MA research proposal

- Shorter in length and duration
- Demonstrate a certain level of understanding of the relevant literature
- Basis ideas on research methodology and significance
- Scope of the research is narrower

PhD research proposal

- Longer in length, scope, and duration
- A literature review that demonstrates a deep understanding of your research area (identify gaps in knowledge and justify the significance of your proposed research)
- A detailed plan for data collection, analysis, and interpretation
- Clearly articulate how the proposed research will advance knowledge in the field
